Regulations

State Regulations

- Seven sets of regulations have been approved for filing with the Secretary of State's office
- One of these sets is a rescission



Regulations

19CSR30-81.015 – Resident Assessment Instrument

- Rescission of rule – requirements covered in federal regulations

Regulations

19CSR30-86.043 – Administrative, Personnel and Resident Care Requirements for Facilities Licensed as a Residential Care Facility II on 8/27/06 that will comply with Residential Care Facility II Standards

- ❑ Allows for persons with a Residential Care and Assisted Living (RCAL) Administrator's license to be the administrator
- ❑ Changes criminal background check requirements so that they are consistent with state statute

Regulations

19CSR30-86.047 – Administrative, Personnel and Resident Care Requirements for Assisted Living Facilities I & II

- ❑ Allows for persons with a Residential Care/Assisted Living (RCAL) Administrator's license to be the administrator

Regulations

Filing

- ❑ Preceding three sets of rules were filed with Secretary of State's office on March 1st
- ❑ Public comment period began April 2nd and ended on May 2nd
- ❑ Final order of rulemaking to be filed with JCAR and SBRFB between May 3rd and June 29th
- ❑ Final order of rulemaking to be filed with SoS office by July 31st
- ❑ Rules become effective 30 days after publishing by SoS office

Regulations

19CSR30-85.022 – Fire Safety Standards for New and Existing Intermediate Care and Skilled Nursing Facilities

- ❑ Changes to be consistent with statutory requirements
 - ❑ Allows for battery-powered smoke alarms in resident rooms until sprinkler system is installed
 - ❑ Clarifies major renovation
- ❑ Requires facility emergency preparedness plans to be provided to local jurisdiction's emergency management director

Regulations

19CSR30-86.022 – Fire Safety Standards for Residential Care Facilities and Assisted Living Facilities

- ❑ Changes to be consistent with statutory requirements
 - ❑ Allows for battery-powered smoke alarms in resident rooms until sprinkler system is installed
 - ❑ Clarifies major renovation
- ❑ Requires facility emergency preparedness plans to be provided to local jurisdiction's emergency management director
- ❑ Adds requirements for oxygen use and storage

Regulations

19CSR30-88.020 – Resident Funds and Property

- ❑ Adds conservator to persons who can authorize use of resident funds
- ❑ Clarifies requirement to notify DSS, MO HealthNet Division for deceased residents
- ❑ Clarifies that bond calculation is for preceding twelve months rather than for preceding calendar year – consistent with statutory change

Regulations

Filing

- ❑ Preceding three sets of rules were filed with Secretary of State's office on March 15th
- ❑ Public comment period began April 16th and ended on May 16th
- ❑ Final order of rulemaking to be filed with JCAR and SBRFB between May 17th and July 13th
- ❑ Final order of rulemaking to be filed with SoS office by July 14th
- ❑ Rules become effective 30 days after publishing by SoS office

Regulations

19CSR30-84.030 – Level I Medication Aide

- ❑ Allows for multiple course manuals – must be approved by the department*
- ❑ Allows for DMH facilities to be training agencies
- ❑ Requires biennial training
- ❑ Allows for DMH Certified Medication Aides to be added to LIMA registry after satisfactory completion of biennial training

*this is SLCR's intent with other programs, including Insulin Administration and CNA

Filing

- ❑ Preceding set of rules was filed with Secretary of State's office on April 2nd
- ❑ Public comment period began May 1st and ended on May 31st
- ❑ Final order of rulemaking to be filed with JCAR and SBRFB between June 1st and July 27th
- ❑ Final order of rulemaking to be filed with SoS office by August 29th
- ❑ Rules become effective 30 days after publishing by SoS office
