

# Missouri COVID-19 Healthcare Response After Action Survey FAQ

## **Can I begin the survey, take a break, and then later finish my responses?**

The survey does not allow you to save progress to return at a later time to complete and submit. However, as long as you do not close the browser your response will remain until you either submit or exit out of the survey.

## **Who should compete the survey?**

The survey should be completed by one representative but include feedback from the entire organization. A detailed perspective from your organization is essential to creating a comprehensive report.

## **How long does this survey take to complete?**

The time required to complete the survey will depend on the scale of your organizations response operations. Setting aside an hour to input the responses into the survey is recommended. However it may take more time to review the questions and gather input from your team before completing the survey. You are able to print the list of questions to take notes prior to completing the survey if you desire.

## **What is the purpose for completing the survey?**

This AAR will help guide future public health and healthcare emergency preparedness planning. By completing this survey your organization is included and represented in the report created by the State of Missouri. As well, this survey is a critical part of the After Action Report (AAR) compiled by DHSS to fulfill the requirements of the PHEP and HPP 5-year joint full scale exercise. Your participation in the survey allows your organization to use the state report to fulfill PHEP & HPP requirements. The AAR will serve instrumental to your organization's planning and justifications related to PHEP, HPP and other funding.

## **Can I share the survey?**

Yes, please share with other healthcare response partners that are listed in the survey and have not received the instructions from the department, their healthcare coalition or other agency.

## **When is the survey due?**

Please submit your response no later than August 25, 2021.
